

TRADITIONAL DRAGON AND LION DANCE

If your children have ever enjoyed a dragon or lion dance at Chinese New Year, then this is the workshop where they can learn to do it themselves! Ling Peng will lead the participants in the dances with child-size dragon and lion, and by the end of the session they'll be delivering the dances with accompanying percussion music.

CHINESE DRAGON-PUPPET AND LANTERN MAKING

Ling Peng will demonstrate and help the participants to make their own 3D dragon puppet, and also a colourful Chinese lantern in this arts and crafts session. All materials are supplied and children will be able to take their colourful creations
