
## Notices

Reading Reward Tea - Due to next week's residential visit, the Spring term reward tea will take place early in the Summer term to ensure that all of the participants from year 5 are able to take part. This means that we can extend the deadline a little so now children can include reading up to and including March 31st towards their total of 60 reads. The reading can be related to books brought home from school or books, magazines and other sources of writing that they have at home. Each piece of reading should be signed off in your child's personal organizer, retrospective additions cannot be made.

As I have said so many times in the past, reading is of vital importance for children not just during their time in education but in improving their life chances going forward. The skill of reading fluently and an interest in reading a wide range of materials are two things that will underpin success in the future. I have seen research that indicates the world of work is expected to undergo significant change over the next decade and beyond and that we need to be preparing children for this now (Research: The skills imperative 2035 NFER).

Primary education is where the fundamentals are put in place and reading is a key part of this so I ask you to keep encouraging your children to read - it will make a difference.

Forest School - I am working with Miss Carr to sort out all of the dates for Forest School in the Summer term. These will be published in full in next week's bulletin as there will be a few changes around Sats week and the year 6 residential.
