Forest School clothing - A polite reminder that children should be adequately clothed to participate safely in Forest School activities. This includes long sleeves and trousers to avoid scratches and grazes. Children also need to be dressed warmly and in waterproof clothing during cold wet weather, such as is forecast over the next few weeks. Waterproof footwear and a change of footwear and clothing are also necessary. For safety reasons, children without the correct clothing and footwear will, sadly, have to miss their session.
