WhatsApp - From time to time I feel the need to send you a message about monitoring your child's use of social media, in this case WhatsApp. While the legal age for use has been lowered to 13 that is still older than any Bispham child. That being said, it would be naïve of me to think that none of our pupils use it. In recent conversations with some parents I have asked about their views and was quite shocked by what they told me.

It seems that parents, who check phones at random times, are regularly shocked by the crudity of the language being used by children they know in day to day life. Similarly, the aggression and bad language, insults and threats to friendships and to share information are regular occurrences. It is as if children forget that what they are sending is being read by real people.

This is deeply alarming. That this type of behaviour seems routine for some is extremely worrying. I cannot urge you strongly enough to monitor what your child does on phones, tablets and gaming devices. We have had incidents in the past where matters have got out of hand and I have had to bring in advice and support from agencies outside of school to ensure children are safe.

I know it won't be popular, but check your child's phone with no notice. This is the only way to know how they are using these platforms so that you can have conversations with them and ultimately make sure they are safe.
